Trial week — QA exploratory testing

The paid one-week trial for the QA Tester role: access, report format, rules, three charters, evaluation

Five working days, paid at the agreed rate after the review regardless of the outcome. The dates, the amount and the accounts come in the e-mail that invites you; everything else is on this page.

Access

- The product: intermind.com. The demo at intermind.com/demo needs no account.
- Two test accounts, host and second participant, sent to you separately. Do not use personal accounts.
- The mobile app: "InterMIND" in the App Store and on Google Play.
- Where to report: a private GitHub repository you are invited to. Every report is one issue filed through the form there; the form's fields are the report format below. Screenshots and recordings are attached to the issue.
- Questions: the contact in your invitation e-mail. Asking is fine; guessing is not.

Report format

One issue per bug.

Field	What goes in it
Title	One line: what is broken, not what you did
Severity	blocker · major · minor · cosmetic · question
Environment	Device, OS, browser or app version, interface language, translation language
Steps	Numbered, from a fresh start, exactly what you clicked or said
Expected	What should have happened
Actual	What happened
Evidence	Screenshot or screen recording attached to the issue
Identifiers	Meeting link, time in UTC to the minute, account used
Reproducibility	Tries and occurrences, e.g. "3/3" or "1/5"

Rules

- Reproduce everything yourself at least twice before you report it, and write the count down.
- Voice and translation bugs: record the screen with audio, so we hear what was said and see what was shown. Speak naturally, in full sentences, for at least 20–30 seconds.
- If something looks wrong and you are not sure whether it is a bug, report it with severity "question". That is better than silence.
- Check the existing issues first. Do not file the same thing twice under different wording.

- Do not describe things you did not see. A report written from assumption rather than observation ends the trial.

Charters

Roughly a day and a half each, in this order. Spend the rest of the week on whatever you found interesting.

Charter 1 — Guest join and host approval

The host (account 1) creates a meeting on desktop web. The second participant joins from a phone via the link without logging in, as a guest. Explore: approval by the host, the name each side sees, what the guest can and cannot do, what happens when the host leaves, when the guest reloads the page, when two guests share a name, when the link is opened in a second tab.

Charter 2 — Live voice translation with two languages

The host speaks English, the participant speaks your second language, chosen from the language picker; if it is not listed, use any language you can pronounce well from a script, such as Spanish. Both on laptops, or laptop plus phone. Explore: switching your language mid-call, muting and unmuting while the other side speaks, two people speaking at once, long sentences against short ones, names and numbers, the chat translation alongside voice, what remains after the call and in which language each side sees it.

Charter 3 — Mobile app against mobile web

The same flows as charters 1 and 2, but compare the native app with the browser on the same phone. Explore: joining from a link when the app is installed, notifications, screen rotation, backgrounding the app during a call, switching to another app and back, poor network (turn Wi-Fi off and on).

How the reports are evaluated

- The share of your reports that we can reproduce from your steps alone.
- Whether severity is sensible: a typo is not a blocker; "cannot hear the other side" is.
- Whether the evidence lets us see the bug without calling you.
- How many distinct things you found beyond the obvious.

Quantity is not a criterion. Ten confirmed bugs beat forty guesses.

The evaluation is done on the last day of the trial from the issues you filed; you get the outcome and a short written review within a few days.
